Steps to Answering an Essay Question

- 1. Clarity: Make sure you understand the question
- 2. Know: Necessary facts & supporting materials
- 3. Apply: Ability to apply reasoning and understanding to course materials

Preparing Before You Answer an Essay Question

- 1. Make notes on back of test to free your mind
- 2. Read directions carefully
 - Do you have a choice (ex: respond to 3 out of 5 questions)
- 3. Read everything
 - Read all the questions: choose questions you're best prepared for
 - Circle key words as you read
- 4. Jot clues alongside each question to help you organize thoughts before writing
- 5. Plan your time
 - Don't use extra time for difficult questions
- 6. Start with the easiest question-this builds confidence!

How to Answer an Essay Question

- 1. Understand question with precision—what idea are they getting at?
- 2. Be explicit and complete
 - Define terms as you write
 - Don't allow inferring or concluding
- 3. Eliminate impressions or feelings
 - Avoid phony & fancy writing...be real
- 4. Be concise
 - Direct and straightforward is most impressive, avoid being wordy
- 5. Spell correctly
 - Avoid misspelled words & grammatical errors (edit your work)
- 6. One idea per paragraph
 - Be organized
 - Write deductive paragraphs: State idea clearly then support with facts
- 7. Understand "pet ideas"
 - Instructors use only a few basic approaches
