### Virginia Environmental Endowment -Mini-Grant Program

The Virginia Mini-Grant Program supports community-based efforts to strengthen environmental education and to promote

stewardship of Virginia's waterways. Public and private schools (K-12) in Virginia are eligible to apply for one-year awards up to \$5,000 to increase training in environmental education for educators and school administrators and to expand the use of existing educational resources (curricula, multi-media programs, publications, field studies) in schools and community programs. Projects must focus on water quality, land use, and/ or sustainable communities. Projects must also include training for teachers/project leaders and service learning activities that engage students and community members in research to solve environmental problems.
